

## Extract from 'Historic Eynsham'

Beyond the library was a barn, part of what was Wintles Farm. Once converted into a bank and now a retail outlet and café.



Moving on across John Lopes Road is the **Catholic Apostolic Church** with its round corner turret with conical roof that once topped a baptistry. Built about 1876 in a Gothic style. Services ceased here after 1982 and the building has since been converted into a private residence.

Next to it is **The Holt** (No. 47) built in fine stone in 1870 in an 'eccentric' Gothic/Italianate fashion, its windows flanked by marble columns with carved capitals and an iron balcony supported by stone griffins. It was designed by the architect of the Randolph Hotel Oxford, William Wilkinson.
