

Privacy and data protection – Eynsham News Group

We are committed to protecting your data and respecting your privacy. We collect and keep your contact details only with your consent; we keep them securely; and we will never share the information you provide with any third party without your explicit consent.

When you sign up to receive our emails, we will ask you for only your name and email address. If you ‘sign up’ in conversation with one of our team, we will also ask for your phone number, in case we have any difficulties with your email address. The information you provide will be used only to send you emails connected with The Eynsham News, apart from exceptional circumstances.

We use a company called MailChimp to process our ‘sign-up’ forms and to deliver our emails. MailChimp stores your personal information on a secure server on our behalf and it has [its own privacy policy](#).

MailChimp collects some other information from you automatically when you interact with our emails - for example, by opening them or clicking on links. This activity information helps us to understand how useful you find our emails. Mailchimp also records your IP address, browser and approximate location; but none of these identify you to us as an individual.

You have a right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you and you may ask us to correct any information that you think is inaccurate or incomplete. To see any of this information, update it, correct it or delete it, click the ‘update subscription preferences’ link at the foot of our emails, or [write to us](#).

You also have a right to opt out of our emails at any time. To remove yourself from mailing our list, click the ‘unsubscribe’ link at the foot of our emails, or [write to us](#).
