In the UK the facts are stark: we live in one of the most nature-depleted countries in the world - 189th out of 218 countries; 41% of our species have declined since 1970. In Oxfordshire, only around 4% of the total land area retains any special value for wildlife.

Eynsham can lead the way in showing how, with some collective hand-holding, individuals and communities can reverse this decline and support nature recovery on a grand scale.

Please Join Us! Put stickers on our map in the Market Garden Shop with suggestions for planting native trees, hedges, wildflower patches and places for ponds. These can be in your own gardens or anywhere else: verges, roundabouts, car parks, churchyards, farmland. On January 15th, join us to discuss how we can implement everyone's ideas.
